

BRIEF GUIDE TO THE SPANISH 2C INTERMEDIATE COURSE:

COURSE DESCRIPTION:

The courses in the Spanish 2 series are a continuation of the fundamental series in helping students to further develop their Spanish skills (reading, listening, speaking, writing) and cultural understanding of the Spanish-speaking world through mostly a content-based and task-supported curriculum. An emphasis will be placed on the exploration of cultural texts and short films.

COURSE/UNIVERSITY POLICY:

1. Class Dynamics. I will attempt to balance a relaxed atmosphere, where students will be willing to use the Spanish language without fear of criticism, with a need for academic excellence. Try, however, not to get as comfortable with the class so as to not study enough; some anxiety about academic performance is always helpful. On the other hand, avoid getting so tense that you "freeze up". Please, avoid monopolizing the class or otherwise creating an uncomfortable atmosphere for your classmates. Remember that I am always available during office hours to help you.

2. Diversity Statement. In this class, we are committed to supporting a diverse community in its many manifestations. This includes but is not limited to race, ethnicity, socioeconomic status, gender, gender identity, sexual orientation, religion, disability, and place of origin. Our

6. Workload. Students with a large course- or workload and students with weak studying skills/habits are not encouraged to take this class until they solve those problems first. Each class will require approximately two hours a day of careful and systematic studying. Without sufficient time and solid studying skills/habits, you will struggle to pass this class. You are strongly advised to evaluate your particular situation carefully **before** deciding to stay in the class.

7. Add/Drop Policy. The School of Humanities follows the university's deadlines on adding and dropping courses. A student may drop a course only during the first two weeks of the quarter and may add a course only during the first three weeks. Students are responsible for making sure they meet all deadlines. 8. Grade Requirement to move on to next level. It is the School of Humanities' policy that, "within the beginning and intermediate foreign language instructional sequences, students must earn a 'C-', 'P' [70.0%], or better, in order to advance to the next level of instruction."

9. Students enrolled in SPAN 2C. To fulfill the School of Humanities Language Other than English requirements, students must earn a **C** or better in SPAN 2C.

COURSE COMPONENTS:

This class will follow a blended format --- face-to-face and asynchronous (online class). Each week, students will attend classes on Tuesdays, Wednesdays, and Thursdays. On Mondays, class will be asynchronous. Students will complete virtual tasks (Tarea Virtual) on Canvas for that day.

1. **Attendance.** To develop communicative skills in Spanish, class attendance is critical; and therefore, it is mandatory. Regular class attendance is expected and essential for successful completion of the course. Students may fail the course due to excessive absences.

You are allowed <u>one</u> absence per quarter. For each absence beyond the first one, your final grade will be lowered **1.0** percentage point. Three "tardies" (arriving within the first ten minutes) constitute an absence. Arriving 10 minutes late will be marked as an absence. Excused absences are granted in the case of a verifiable emergency (e.g., medical or legal leave). You are required to present proper documentation. It is your responsibility to make up all the work and meet all required deadlines. You will sign an attendance agreement stating that you have understood the attendance policy.

2. **Participation.** Being prepared for and participating in class activities are some of the most important means of attaining the goals of this course. This course requires active participation in Spanish, which involves arriving to class well prepared, participating in group activities and class discussions, volunteering to answer questions or sharing ideas, and remaining on-task. Using your laptop for surfing the web, checking email, sending instant messages, speaking to class mates in English about unrelated class discussions or similar behavior is disruptive to class and will **negatively** affect your participation grade. Participation grade will be evaluated during the middle and end of the quarter using a Participation rubric. The instructor will calculate the average of both grades.

Procedure to follow: Students will complete the Participation Evaluation sheet that is uploaded on the Canvas course page. Please make sure that you complete this evaluation by the due date which can be found on your syllabus. <u>You have to grade yourself</u>. For each statement, choose a number that you feel best reflects your participation. When you finish, tally the numbers you chose and place the sum total at the bottom in the space provided. After you have completed the sheet, the instructor will review it and using the rubric, will decide your final Participation grade.

3. **Supersite homework.** You will see <u>required</u> activities from the *Supersite*. You are expected to complete all of the exercises assigned in the *Supersite* as indicated on the syllabus. Your overall grade for each *Lección* (9, 10, 11, and 12) will be based on: **a.** completion of all exercises; and **b.** the effort you put to completing the activities.

The activities are graded by Supersite and your instructor will get a percentage of your grade. For the activities, you will have a second attempt to resubmit activities with corrections from the first attempt.

Overall Grade Scale (for each *Lección*): **100 points:**

a. All or nearly all (maybe missed one or two) activities for that *Lección* were completed.
b. The effort to complete the exercises was <u>EXCELLENT</u> based on the high percentage scores obtained (above 85%).

75 points:

a. The majority of the exercises for that *Lección* were completed.

b. The effort to complete the exercises was <u>SATISFACTORY</u> based on the percentages obtained (70-84%).

55 points:

a. Less than the majority of the exercises for that *Lección* were completed.

b. The effort to complete the exercises was <u>UNSATISFACTORY</u> based on the percentages obtained (less than 70%).

0 point:

None or close to none (only completed one or two) of the activities were completed.

4. **Tareas Virtuales**. For asynchronous (online) classes on Mondays, students will be required to complete virtual tasks on Canvas by 6:00 p.m. PT (Pacific Time in California). Should a Monday be a holiday, then the assigned Tarea Virtual will be due by Tuesday at 6:00 p.m. PT (Pacific Time in California). Any late completions will be graded with a "0" unless the student has documentation to justify completing late the virtual task(s). All virtual tasks will be graded based on the scale below. For a number of the virtual tasks, your instructor will ask you to redo a certain part based on her/his feedback to get additional points. You have two days to complete the redo components. Failure to redo any part will result in a reduction of 3 points to the original grade.

100 points: Completion of *all* components of the virtual task(s). *Excellent* effort in completing the virtual task(s)
85 points: Completion of *all* components of the virtual task(s). *Satisfactory* effort in completing the virtual task(s).
70 points: Completion of *most* components of the virtual task(s). *Some satisfactory* effort in completing the virtual task(s).
9 points: No completion or only completion of one component of the virtual task(s).

5. Redacciones (writing tasks). You will complete a 300-350 word writing task with a first and second draft. With instructor feedback from your first draft, you will make edits to produce your second draft. To encourage you to write a good first draft, you can only receive a total of 3 additional points added to your second draft grade. The final grade will consist of the average of both drafts. If you fail to complete the second draft, 3 points will be subtracted from your first draft. For example, if you received a 75 for the first draft, your second draft grade will be a 72. Along with the revisions to the second draft, students must submit a one-paragraph reflection in English stating what they learned from the editing process. After you have submitted the second draft, you will receive your grades for both drafts.

6. Oral Presentations – **Presentación de noticias.** Each student will do a 10 minute (5 minute presenting; 5 minute class discussion) presentation on a current news event from the Spanish-speaking world. The presentation should be from a newspaper article in Spanish printed in Spain, Latin America or the U.S. It is designed as an oral expression (not as a reading and writing) activity. You may use flashcards or a PPP containing only words or short phrases, not sentences. More information on the presentations as well as grading is available on Canvas.

7. Midterm Exam. The midterm exam will reflect topics from chapters (Lección) 9 to 10. Your instructor will provide you with a study guide with the specific topics of the midterm to help you study better. The midterm will include listening, reading, vocabulary and grammar sections and it will take two days to complete. To complete the midterm exam, students will use an online proctoring program on Canvas named *Respondus Lockdown Browser* (see below) in person at the designated testing site. If you do not have access to a laptop to bring to class for the midterm or final exam, one may be rented from the library. A webcam is not required.

If a student misses the midterm due to a **documented police, court or medical emergency of your own,** students must make up the midterm within 3 days. If a student is not able to make it up within the 3 days due to extenuating circumstances, it is the responsibility of the student to contact the instructor with proper documentation and to make arrangements.

8. Final Exam. This exam will reflect the overall emphasis given to most of the skills practiced during the quarter. Please make sure to refer to the first page of the syllabus for date, time and place of the final exam. **It is your responsibility** to resolve any scheduling conflicts you may have due to work, other exams, etc., **before** that date. To complete the final exam, students will use an online proctoring program on Canvas named *Respondus Lockdown Browser* (see below) in person at the designated testing site.

9. Exam Proctoring. You will use *Respondus LockDown Browser* to complete the midterm and final exams. Please be sure that you know how to use this program. Please note that these exams will be taken **in person** with the instructor in class but will be taken on canvas using a computer. If you do not have access to a laptop to bring to class for the midterm or final exam, one may be rented from the library. A webcam is not required.

10. Extra Credit Policy. Students may receive 2 extra points added to their midterm grade for attending an online event sponsored by the Department of Spanish and Portuguese and writing a one-paragraph reflection. Please note that students can only get extra credit for *one* event that they attended in the department.
